Rob Knapp's requests for amendments to the 17<sup>th</sup> September Minutes

"WW1 commemorative theme would be covered in all schools" - NC said that the theme was being covered in schools.

Suzanne Nockles, on 22nd May (AGM), said she hoped that the Congregational church's celebration of the life of a Conscientious Objector in Kibworth would not offend members. RK expressed his sadness that this apology was deemed necessary in such a gathering.

RK said that his remark that to him it was disappointing that the Forum had not taken up the challenge of mindfulness of WW1 was again omitted from the minutes. On the 24th he noted that there had been good events, nevertheless, including a moving concert the previous Saturday.

RK said that at the 17th Sept. meeting he had asked whether Christian names could be used in the minutes and thought the meeting had considered this. He wondered why initials were now used. (The meeting approve this practice).

RK had mentioned that The Bower House needed a fully organised funding programme which was sustainable into the future. This could be looked at as a specialist matter and commented that help could be available in the Anglican diocese for this. This to be looked at further.

RK queried on 17th Sept why the Harborough by the Sea had been undertaken by the Baptist Church and not the CTH. RK praised the event because of the opportunities afforded to children who might not be able to go on holiday and the excellent involvement of Laing O'Rourke (Severn Trent) and Helen Nicholls (HDC Officer).
